Propose USOC/NGB housing alternatives for non-delegation members (ie. extra officials, board members):

SF 2012 can propose several alternatives for housing non-delegation members. First, we have identified and secured (in our bid submission) an outstanding hotel in San Francisco for the USOC's use. The Argent Hotel has 667 rooms. The Argent is in close proximity to the proposed and secured IOC Hotel, the San Francisco Marriott, a short two-blocks away.

In addition to the Argent, the USOC and the NGB's will have access to more than 800 beds which are available just at the entrance to the Olympic Village. We have supplied 1600 beds for As-accredited officials in this location, but have the additional beds available. This would make an outstanding and cost-effective accommodation for officials and sports management from the NGB's.

Finally, in each of the IF hotels identified, more than ample space exists for the NGB representatives from the respective sports. These locations would allow the NGB representatives to be located as close as possible to the competition venues for their sports.
