Celebrate Olympic Day with multiple events around the San Francisco Bay Area, plus announcement
of 2013 – 2014 NCO Travel & Training Grant Winners

Events are part of 700+ nationwide events celebrating the birth of the modern Olympic Games

San Francisco, CA, USA – The spirit of the Olympic Movement will roll into the San Francisco Bay Area, as BASOC and the Northern California Olympians coordinate clinics, demonstrations and exhibitions in celebration of Olympic Day.

Olympic Day, held annually on June 23, is celebrated by millions of people in more than 160 countries. Commemorating the birth of the modern Olympic Games, Olympic Day is not only a celebration, but an international effort to promote fitness and well-being in addition to the Olympic ideals of fair play, perseverance, respect and sportsmanship.

Anne Warner Cribbs, BASOC CEO and 1960 Olympian explains, "We are excited to take part in Olympic Day and inspire kids in the San Francisco Bay Area to dream about participating in the Olympic Games. The Olympic Spirit is alive and well in the San Francisco Bay Area and BASOC is proud to support the Olympic Movement and encourage children to lead healthy, active lives."

Events in Northern California include Fencing, Weightlifting, Water Polo, Swimming, Synchronized Swimming, Table Tennis, Wheel Chair Basketball, Running, Adaptive Cycling and Soccer. A complete list with locations, times and dates is attached to this release.

BASOC's activities are some of more than 700 events taking place nationwide between June 21st and 30th. The events, designed to engage youth and promote the ideals of the Olympic movement, feature athlete appearances, family-friendly activities and interactive learning experiences.

Greg Massialas, President of the Northern California Olympians, three-time Olympian and current Olympic fencing coach, adds, "Northern California is home to over 450 Olympians and Paralympians from past and current teams. We are delighted to share our pride and love of the Olympic Games with future generations of Olympians and Paralympians."

Around the world, more than 160 countries take part in the annual celebration. Olympic Day, created in 1948 to commemorate the birth of the modern Olympic Games, focuses on the Olympic values and ideals such as fair play, perseverance, respect and sportsmanship. In the U.S., Olympic Day events range from small gatherings to large, city-wide events.
